EVENT REGULATIONS

1. Entries will not be accepted unless the total entry fees accompany your entry forms and waiver.
2. Entries will not be accepted unless the Liability Waiver has been signed by owners and exhibitors of all horses.
3. No change of rider/handler is allowed without advising the show office at least one hour prior to the event taking place.
4. Permanent numbers will be used at this show, if you do not have a permanent number, please contact wapha.committee@outlook.com.
5. Youth ages will be as of 1st August, and all youth competitors must have the written permission of a parent or guardian or legal guardian to compete.
6. All youth competing or taking part in a WAPHA event, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to be at that event as a contestant or participant and in the case of a contest, the parent/guardian must also sign the entry form. All youth competing or taking part in an event must be in the care of a responsible adult who is in attendance for the duration of that event.
7. All participants are to follow the venue regulations.
8. Please refer to the AQHA rule book for the latest rules and regulations. It is important to familiarise yourself with these rules. This event is run under AQHA rules. Those Rules and Regulations can be found on the AQHA website – www.aqha.com.au
9. On each day of the show, 1 hour prior to the commencement of the show and 1 hour after the cessation of the show there will be no training equipment allowed in the immediate marshalling area and the performance arena. Dress regulations of Cap/Hat, long western style pants, safe enclosed footwear and a shirt with sleeves must be worn, as per AQHA Rulebook.
10. Exhibitors shall not approach the judge for any reason prior to completion of the judging unless the exhibitor has finished exhibiting and the request must be made through the Ring Steward. No exhibitor will request information from the judge, or the decisions made by that judge, concerning any exhibit at a show, on the day of the show or within the immediate 7 days following the show.
11. Competitors realize that horse related competition has an inherent risk and as such compete at this competition at their own risk. The WAPHA and show organisers will accept no liability for accident, loss, or injury. This applies to all competitors, their connections, horses, and spectators.
12. Please be familiar with the AQHA Animal Welfare Policy, this will be strictly adhered to. Each participant has a responsibility to protect the welfare all horses and to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect, and compassion.
13. Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the Affiliate and other competitors.
14. Competitors/participants are to always demonstrate good sportsmanship, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated.
15. Riders and handlers must always be correctly attired including western hat/helmet and riding boots. Any person not correctly attired will not be allowed into the Marshalling arenas.
16. No alcohol is allowed in, or can be consumed in the marshalling areas, working arenas or show pen/contest areas.
17. Every horse entered for competition shall be under the control of the Show Manager or such person/s he/she appoints to act on their behalf.
18. Only contestants in the specific classes and Show Officials will be allowed in the competition arena or marshalling area during the judging.
19. The Show Manager or such person he appoints shall have authority to remove any exhibitor from the area for inhumane treatment and/ or training of any horse or the failure to observe the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the Rules and Regulations of the AQHA. Your co-operation is expected.
20. Show management may exclude horses from competition should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the horse into the competition arena.
21. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present themselves at the competition arena gate when called. Failure to report on the final call will result in disqualification from the class. If a horse is

excluded from entry, all entry fees and charges for the class are forfeited without Liability to the show organisers/committee.

22. Show management reserves the right to change the order of classes before or during the show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of any changes, which will be posted at the Show Secretary's office and announced. Every endeavour will be made to give one hour's notice of any changes to the running order of events; however, every endeavour will be made to avoid changes.
23. Any exhibitor or rider who refuses to obey the request of the Judge, Show Manager or any show official will be automatically disqualified from further competition at the show and forfeits all previous winnings together with all entry fees and other charges. At the discretion of the Show Manager or show committee, the offending individual and his/her entire exhibit may be removed from the grounds.
24. All horses must be serviceably sound. In case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge and/or Show Management, may, if he/she so desires, have the animal examined by the Show Veterinarian at the owner's cost and his decision shall be final.
25. The disputes committee shall consist of the Show Manager, one Show committee member and one competitor.
26. Protests must be made in writing to the show secretary and be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. A cash fee of \$50 must accompany any protest.
27. If a horse is vetted out and the horse has been entered in a youth event, then that youth can use a replacement horse if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show.
28. Competitors that are unable to compete in an event due to rider/horse health reasons will be offered a show credit only if a dated Doctor/Veterinary incl farrier certificate is submitted prior to the event.
29. Amateurs and Youth can nominate a maximum of only two horses that will count towards the 'High Point' Award. This must be nominated on your entry form.
30. Drug testing may be performed at this show.
31. Camping and stable booking to be made directly with the venue unless otherwise stated on the program.
32. Any horse entered in 3 years and over led performance classes (lunge line and led trail) may not enter any ridden classes at the same event.
33. In the case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses and humans, neither the WAPHA nor the sponsors or show organisers will be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.
34. In the event of a pandemic outbreak, the WAPHA will follow government advice. If a cancellation of a WAPHA event is recommended, the WAPHA will offer a show credit to those participants who had entered. A show credit will also be offered to those affected as 'Essential Workers'.
35. If high point categories are awarded at the conclusion of the event, criteria will be outlined on the program.
36. AA Show mandatory prize money – Each event that prize money is applicable to will be noted beside each individual event on the program. Prize money allocation will be, 1st place = \$20, 2nd place = \$10.
37. Jackpot prize money – If entry fees are to be jackpotted, the minimum number of entries will be stated on the program, If Jackpot prize money is allocated it will be noted beside the individual event on the show program. Jackpot prize money allocation will be 1st place = 50%, 2nd place = 20%, 3rd place = 10%, 20% retained by WAPHA.
